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

CEO and Chair message

At EACH Housing, our purpose is clear: to provide affordable, safe and secure housing for those who need it the most.

In 2024–2025, we accommodated 149 occupants across our housing portfolio, maintaining an occupancy rate of approximately 98%. Our housing options continue to include our long-term rental housing, specialist disability accommodation as well as crisis housing, and in December 2024, we established our affordable housing program.

This year, we made meaningful progress toward our Strategic Plan objectives. We upgraded assistive technology in our specialist disability accommodation dwellings, enhancing the amenity and independence of our renters. We introduced a long-term affordable housing initiative, offering homes to families at risk of homelessness or facing

housing distress in the private rental market.

Our biannual renter events and quarterly newsletters helped foster connection and engagement, and our 2024 renter satisfaction survey reflected strong results:

- 83% satisfaction with housing services
- 76% satisfaction with renter engagement
- 92% satisfaction with repairs and maintenance

Our partnerships continued to strengthen our impact. We successfully delivered the Homes for Families (H4F) transitional housing program ahead of schedule, in collaboration with Homes Victoria, Anglicare Victoria and Each. We maintained our strong relationships with Homes Victoria, Wellways and the Bright Church (Wantirna) - whose Christmas giving campaign provided over 80 Coles gift vouchers, as well as the Country Women's Association (Wandin chapter), whose generous donation supported our mission.

EACH Housing is also a place where our people thrive. We achieved 100% staff retention — well above the sector average — and invested in wellbeing, safety and professional development. Our team embraced flexible working arrangements and new tools to improve consistency and efficiency, ensuring we continue to deliver high-quality services.

Looking ahead, our focus remains on delivering our Strategic and Business Plan objectives, supporting our renters, strengthening partnerships, and empowering our dedicated team.





Greg's journey to independence with EACH Housing

When Greg moved into his EACH Housing home in March 2025, it was the first time in a long time he felt truly independent — free to live life on his own terms and no longer defined by disability.

Living with motor neurone disease (MND), Greg had spent time in hospital while applying for Specialist Disability Accommodation and the support hours he needed to live safely and independently. It was a tough time. He'd left his family home and didn't know where he'd end up.

"I was living in a palliative care hospital," Greg shares. "I had nowhere else to go."

When Greg discovered EACH Housing's property, it immediately felt like the right fit. EACH Housing offered the flexibility and support he needed to make the move possible.

"I'd looked at other places, but the questions I was being asked made me feel uncomfortable. EACH was different. They were welcoming."

The location was ideal, and the facilities exceeded his expectations.

"It's perfect," Greg says.

LIVING LIKE HIMSELF AGAIN

Now, Greg feels safe. He feels secure. And most importantly, he feels like himself.

"I've got my independence back. I'm slowly getting my life back together. I have freedom. I'm living like a normal person here."

Unlike other housing models he'd explored, Greg isn't tied to a single support provider. He's able to bring in his own trusted support workers during the day, while EACH Housing ensures overnight support is always available.

"The support here is tailored around my needs. Not around what someone else thinks I need."

A HOME THAT WORKS FOR HIM

Greg's home is fully accessible, with ceiling hoists and thoughtful design features that make daily life easier. It's not just functional — it's empowering.

"I don't feel like I'm a disabled person here. That makes a huge difference."

A LONGSTANDING CONNECTION


Greg's journey with EACH Housing's parent company, Each, started long before he moved into his current home. He's accessed services like podiatry and NDIS support over the years.

"All my dealings with EACH Housing and Each have been great. Everyone I've worked with has made things simple and really good."

LOOKING FORWARD

For Greg, this home isn't just a place to live — it's a place to rebuild. EACH Housing has given him the space, support, and respect to live life on his own terms.

"I'm really happy," he says. "EACH Housing is great. The house is great. I feel like I belong here."
